Why Don't We Ask for Advice More Often?

"The wise man is glad to be instructed, but a self-sufficient fool falls flat on his face" (Prov. 10:8, LB)

We don't want to face up to what we already know we should do.

We fear being seen as weak.

"... be humble, take advice, and become wise" (Prov. 13:10, LB)

We assume that there's nothing anyone else can teach us . . .

• ... when we think we are too advanced.

"Do you see a man wise in his own eyes? There is more hope for a fool than for him" (Prov. 26:12, NIV)

• ... when we think our situation is too unique.

"As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another" (Prov. 27:17, NIV)
