Five reasons we stay stuck in sin—and how to rise above!

First, w	ve get a cheap from sin.
	Proverbs 10:23 (GNT) , "It is foolish to enjoy doing wrong. Intelligent people take pleasure in wisdom."
	Solution: Pray for the joy of the Lord, because "the joy of the Lord is your strength" (Neh. 8:10, NIV).
Secon	nd, we won't what we've done as sin.
	Proverbs 30:20 (GNT) , "This is how an unfaithful wife acts: she commits adultery, takes a bath, and says, 'But I haven't done anything wrong!'"
	Solution: Take a searching and fearless moral inventory of yourself. "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:8-9, NIV).

	Proverbs 30:12 (NASB) , "There is a kind who is pure in his own eyes, yet is not washed from his filthiness."
	Solution: Measure yourself up against Jesus who left you "an example, that you should

follow in his steps" (1 Peter 2:21, NIV).

Proverbs 13:9 (GNT), "Stupid people refuse to turn away from evil."

Proverbs 26:11 (GNT), "A fool doing some stupid thing a second time is like a dog going back to its vomit"

Solution: Putt your sins behind you, because "Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death" (2 Corinthians 7:10, NIV).
