#### Get to Know You

### Study the Book

Read Revelation 6:1-8

#### Before we'll see God's best, we'll see humanity's worst.

In these verses, the Lamb opened the seals. How is the Lamb described in the previous chapter? Who is this Lamb?

What items or actions are connected with the four horses:

What meaning/significance do these items suggest as we interpret this passage?

Who gives the horseman their gifts?

Pastor Tom mentioned one of the first truths that we are often taught concerning God is that God is great and God is good.

How can these attributes of God comfort us during something as chaotic as what is described in Revelation 6?
