Study the Book

What is this hope?

All of our deepest longings will be met by the God who is great and good.

We long for recognition.

Why do you think we long to be recognized?

We long for restoration.

How does Christianity differ from other religions in regard to the restoration of our world?

We long for reunion.

How do these verses describe the reunion of God's dwelling place among His people? How will God personally be involved with His people?
