Study the Book

Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-3

Instead of regarding love as optional, recommit to the necessity of love (vv. 1-3)

Instead of regarding love as sentimental, recommit to the true character of love.

Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-7

What action words from these verses do you find to be hard work?

To love is to act. There are things to start doing and things to quit doing. It's practical.

Concerning the practical aspect of love, do you find it harder to start behaviors/actions that show love or to stop behaviors/actions that do not show love?

Instead of regarding love as peripheral, recommit to the permanence of love.

Read 1 Corinthians 13:8-13

Paul is warning us against the tendency to have all our attention on what we need for life now and miss what will remain forever. He's saying, 'Be thankful for the temporary gifts and experiences God provides to get us through this life, but don't let that be the end-all and beall of the Christian life.'
