The Case for the Bible's Miracles

Read Psalm 78:16-17 and Psalm 104:10-13

How do these verses illustrate the difference between "laws of nature" and "miracles?"

My point is that from the biblical worldview, miracles are possible because of what kind of God the universe has. Even what we call "the laws of nature" is God at work. Modern science developed in a Western culture where people believed that God acted in habitual predictable ways and to investigate those ways was to learn more about God.
