Read Psalm 19:1-2

How have you seen the evidence of God in creation?

#### Read John 1:11

If the world in general has some instinctive knowledge of God through nature, the Jewish people had even more. They had God's very words, the Bible. God had revealed more of himself to them than to any other people. But when he came to his own in Jesus, his own did not receive him.

Maybe your biography is in verse 11. Oh, not because you're Jewish, but because most of you listening to this message were raised in a family that went to church. Your parents made sure you went to Vacation Bible School and youth camp. You know something about the Bible. And yet, here you are in your 20s or your 40s or your senior adult years, and still, as verse 11 says, you have not received him. Jesus is nothing more than a name in a storybook of your childhood.
