We'll never be satisfied with who we are unless our self-identity is in relation to Jesus.

Jesus is the Sin-Bearer.

Read John 1:29

What is significant about being the Lamb of God?

As we stand at the foot of the cross and look up, our true worth and our unworthiness is finally revealed to us. We see our worth in the greatness of his love, a worth that none of our earthly disappointments and failures can take away. At the same time, at the foot of the cross we see our unworthiness in the greatness of our sin, and so we can no longer define ourselves by all our successes and achievements.

Read Matthew 3:13-17
